9. REPORT OF TOWN OFFICIALS:

- **Highway:** Highway Superintendent Brad Schiralli gave his report to the Board.

The Town's new brush cutter head, that we had bought for the excavator, has broken. It is currently at Bobcat getting a new hydraulic motor. This is all covered under warranty.

B1 the 2022 Chevy pickup truck is currently at Rick Bokman's in Wellsville. We had taken the truck to Rick Bokman's because it had a tick noise to the engine. Still unsure of what is going on with the engine? They had told me that they had found metal shavings in the oil. I will keep you updated.

I would like to discuss the Wappsseney extension or access road that we had talked about a couple board meetings ago. Ed Adams (local contractor) and land owner Craig Marcheson have taken the liberty to complete this project on their own. I had met with Tom Windus from Allegany County DPW to discuss this particular intersection and what our other options are, of this new access road. He suggested that it was not a good idea to continue with this particular access road onto Horse Run. He is concerned about safety issues and suggested other options we could think about. I would like to discuss what we need to do to alleviate any liability the Town would have on this intersection if there should happen to be an accident?

Board advised Mr. Schiralli to speak with Town Attorney to see about this.

Cemetery electric? We have the Town's excavator down to the cemetery by the spring house trying to clean some of the debris up around the spring house, so we can access this area. On Thursday October 23rd the Town of Belfast will be bringing their bucket truck over to help trim branches and fix the electric line. Once we get the electric line all fixed and hung back up on the poles and reconnected to the building we will then see if this changes anything with the operation of the water pump? If this does not solve the problem, we may need to get an electrician to try and figure out our voltage issue?

Roadside mower quotes. I currently have two roadside mower quotes, and awaiting on the 3rd. The lower of the two quotes is from George and Swede and is \$9,500. This will give us a budgetary number for the 2026 budget.

Road work. We have been currently working on Anderson Hollow. We changed three crossover sluice pipes in the road, and have been cleaning ditches with the excavator.

Scott hollow road. We had used our new brush cutter on the entire Scott hollow road. We have cleaned the ditches put down a layer of gravel down, graded and rolled.

Snow removal equipment. We have been working on getting the trucks and sanders ready for winter.

No word on the new 2024 International plow/ dump truck. ValleyFab has not even called to have us take the box over to the body company, Keith Harms Angelica. I'm suspecting that we will not have this truck until after the first of the year.

99 International. With the above paragraph we will need to operate the 99 International plow/dump truck we currently have for snow removal. This 99 International dump truck will need to have the walking beam bushings replaced on the suspension. I am currently getting quotes on rebushing the walking beams.

CHIPS. I have an appointment tomorrow at 11:00 a.m. to take all of our CHIPS reimbursement paperwork to Dawn Sutfin New York State DOT CHIPS filing representative. CPR course for employees. I would like to discuss a CPR course for myself and all employees. I had discussed this with the employees and they would be on board taking a CPR course.
